Report on Nikshay Mitra Awareness & Registration Program

Rajkumari Amrit Kaur College of Nursing (RAKCON), New Delhi, Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, University of Delhi organized The Nikshay Mitra Awareness & Registration Program for BSc (H) Nursing final year students held on 20 September 2025 at RAKCON (Class Room No 1) aimed to mobilize community support for tuberculosis (TB) patients through the Ni-kshay 2.0 portal. The event reinforced India's national goal to eliminate TB by 2025 and showcased how nutritional, diagnostic and vocational assistance from community donors (Nikshay Mitras) complements government schemes such as Nikshay Poshan Yojana.

Objectives of program are to Raise awareness about TB as a public health challenge and the Nikshay Mitra initiative, facilitate on-the-spot registration of new Nikshay Mitras via the Ni-kshay 2.0 portal, mobilize community networks to provide nutritional, diagnostic and vocational support to TB patients, strengthen partnerships between health institutions, civil society and individual donors.

The session was taken by Mrs. Priyanka MSc Nursing final year student. The session covered: **Nikshay Mitra Concept:** Detailed explanation of how individuals and organizations can become community supporters for TB patients.

Registration Process- Step-by-step guidance on using the Ni-kshay 2.0 portal for Mitra registration.

Support Categories- Information about the types of support - nutritional (food baskets worth INR 800 per month), additional diagnostic, vocational assistance and psychosocial support (counselling, emotional wellbeing, support to reduce stigma)

A total of 68 students attended the session.

The session highlighted the importance of nutritional, diagnostic, vocational, and psychosocial support in empowering TB patients and supporting India's TB elimination mission.
